

The Fallacy of the Middle Class: Overcoming Social Resentment



*In 2011, a family of four earning less than \$23,021 annually

was considered poor by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Reviewing and correcting the definition of the Middle-Class Income

The household income of our Middle Class Family in study is US\$28,800/year or US\$80/day per household. I have divided this income/day between 4 members of the family, in order to compare with this Pew Research Center graph... Just to compare on the same page. This implies a figure of US\$ 20/day per person pppd (for a Four-Person Household).

- US\$20/day pppd (for a Four Person Household) instead of US\$11/day pppd must be the low threshold for Middle-Income definition globally regardless of the PPP or Power Purchase Parity conditions for each country.
- In terms of annual income: When defining Middle-Class, if we consider the income distribution only: the lower limit has to be adjusted to an annual household income of \$28,800/year and the upper limit at US\$175,200/year. This is a reasonable definition of Who could be considered the Middle-Income Globally Speaking.

I suggest that a family of four with income inflows of less than US\$28,800 annually has to be considered low-income class and poor. For Eleonora Escalante Strategy, even the chold Low Middle-Class is still poor or suffers of multidimensional poverty.



Reviewing and correcting the definition of the Middle-Class Income

Distribution of population between different poverty thresholds, World, 1981 to 2015



Poverty thresholds are all in 'international dollars' at constant 2011 PPP prices. This means all figures account for cross-country differences in price levels, as well as for inflation.



- For Eleonora Escalante Strategy, even the Low Middle-Class is still poor or suffers of multidimensional poverty. The Middle-Class is only the 12% of the population globally.
- We have adjusted the range income for a Middle-Class definition considering a bottom-up approach of a budget 50/30/20 of a LMIC Salvadoran Family with earnings of US\$28,800/year.
- Our research discovery suggest that for a family of four, the middle-class families households should be between US\$28,800/year (US\$20/day pppd) and US\$175,200/year (US\$120/day).
- Still with US\$20/day pppd, the low middle class (LMIC) endure some kind of poverty.
- The rest of the global population (84%) is poor, regardless if it is lowincome or extreme poor.
