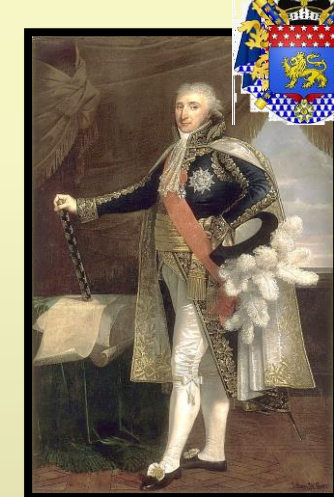
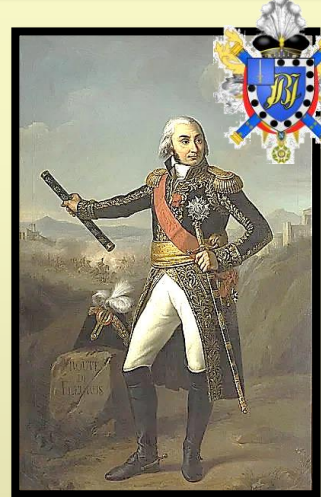

The Marshals of Napoleon (1/4)

Napoleon: French General, First consul and Emperor of the French (1769-1821)

The Marshals of Napoleon were in total 26. The first round of 18 were appointed in 1804



Marshal Louis Alexandre Berthier (1753-1815)
 Sovereign Prince of Neuchatel, Wagram and Valangin. Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour. Commander of the Order of Saint Louis. Vice-Grand Constable of France. His wife was Maria Elizabeth Wittelsbach, duchess of Bavaria Palatine Birkenfeld. Died in an accident.

Marshal Joachim Murat (1767-1815)
 First Prince of Murat. Grand Duke of Cleves and Berg. King of Naples. Brother-in-law of Napoleon. Died executed by the Bourbons.

Marshal Bon Adrien Jannot de Moncey, (1774-1842.
 Duke de Conegliano and Peer of France. Died of Natural Causes.

Marshal Jan Baptiste Jourdan. Count of the Empire (1762-1833)
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor, Grand Cross of the Order of Saint Hubert, Grand Dignitary of the Royal Order of the Two-Sicilies, Knight of the Order of Saint Louis, Knight of the Order of the Holy Spirit. Died of Natural Causes.

Marshal André Massena (1756-1817)
 Duke of Rivoli, Prince of Essling. Grand Chevalier of the Dynastic Wittelsbach Order of Saint-Hubert. Died of Natural Causes

Marshal Charles Pierre Francois Augereau (1757-1816)
 Duke of Castiglione. Grand Officer of the Legion of Honor. Grand Cross of the Order of Charles III of Spain. Knight of the Order of Saint Louis. Peer of France. Died of natural causes

Marshal Jean Baptiste Jules Bernadotte (1763-1844)
 Prince of Ponte Corvo, Crown Prince of Sweden, King of Sweden. Grand Master Order of the Seraphim, of the Order of the Sword, of the Polar Star, of the Order of Vasa. Grand Collar Legion of Honor. Grand Cross of the Iron Cross. Knight of the Order of St. George 1st Class, of the Iron Crown, of the Elephant, Military Order of Maria Theresa. Died of natural causes

Napoleon: French General, First consul and Emperor of the French (1769-1821)

The Marshals of Napoleon were in total 26. The first round of 18 were appointed in 1804



Marshal Jean de Dieu Nicolas Sout (1769-1851)
1st Duke of Dalmatia
Died of Natural Causes.
After Napoleon he was named Council of Ministers. Minister of war to King Louis Philippe I.



Guillaume Marie-Anne Brune (1763-1815)
Count of Brune. Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor. Grand Cross of Saint Louis.
Died Murdered in Avignon.



Marshal Jean Lannes (1769-1809)
Duke of Montebello. Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor. Commander of the Order of the Iron Crown.
Duke of the Empire. Died of wounds of battle



Marshal Adolphe Edouard Casimir Joseph Mortier (1768-1835)
Duke of Treviso.
Grand Cordon of the Legion of Honor
Grand Cross of the Military Order of Jesus Christ. Peer of France.
Killed by infernal Machine.



Marshal Michel Ney (1769-1815)
Duk of Elchingen. Prince of Moskowa. Grand Cross Legion of Honor. Knight Order of the Iron Crown
Died executed after Trial by the Chamber of Peers.



Marshal Louis Nicolas Davout (1770-1823)
Duke of Auerstadt, Prince of Eckmuhl.
Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Legion of Honour, of the Iron Crown, Grand Cross and Star of the Virtuti Militari, Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the White Eagle, of the Order of Christ, of the Military Order of St. Henry, of the Military Order of Max Joseph, of the Royal Order of St. Stephen of Hungary, of the Military Order of Maria Theresa, and Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the Elephant

 Count and Duke of Valmy
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour, Order of the Red Eagle
 Grand Cross of the Order of the Württemberg Crown
 Grand Dignitary of the House Order of Fidelity. Grand Cross of the Order of Saint Louis. Died natural causes.

Marshal Francois Joseph Lefebvre (1755-1820)
 Count and Duke of Dantzig
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor.
 Died of Natural Causes



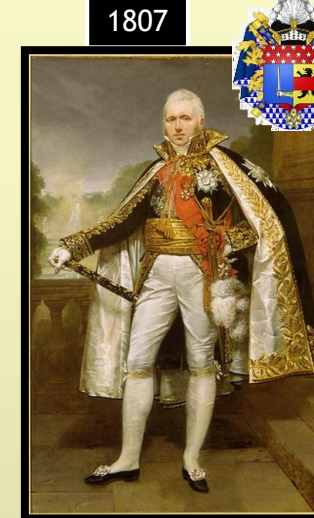
Marshal Dominique Catherine de Perignon (1754-1818)
 Count. Marquis of Perignon.
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour. Peer of France.
 Order of Saint Louis.
 Died of Natural Causes.



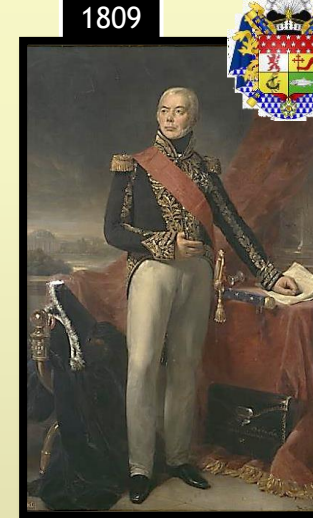
Marshal Jean Mathieu Philibert Serurier (1842-1819)
 Count of the Empire.
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour-
 Order of Saint-Louis
 Order of the Iron Crown.
 Died of Natural Causes.



Marshal Jean Baptiste Bessieres (1768-1813)
 Duke of Istria
 Grand Officer and Grande Eagle of the Legion of Honor.
 Commander of the Iron of Crown Italy.
 Order of the Golden Eagle Wurttemberg.
 Grand cross of the Military Order of Saint Henry. Grand Cross of the Order of Christ Portugal. Grand Cross of the Imperial Order of Leopold Austria.
 Died: Assassinated in Lutzen.



Marshal Claude Victor Perrin (1764-1841)
 Duke of Bellune
 Minister of War



Marshal Jacques Etienne Joseph Alexandre MacDonald (1765-1840)
 Duke of Tarentum
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour and Chancellor of the Legion of Honour
 Band of the Holy Spirit.
 Died of Natural Causes

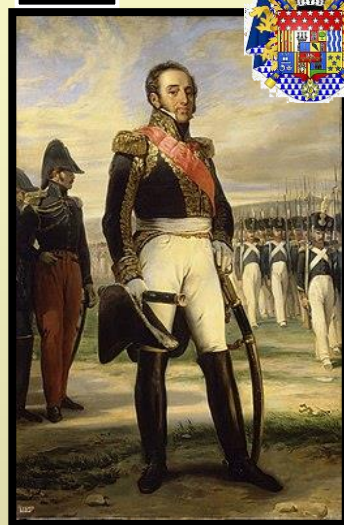
Marshal Nicolas Charles Oudinot (1767-1847)

 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor
 Died of Natural Causes

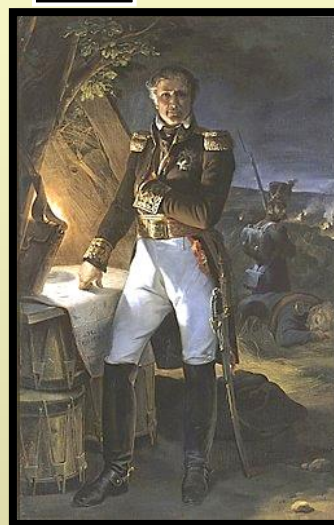
Marshal Auguste Frederick Louis Viesses de Marmont (1774-1852)
 Duke de Ragusa
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor
 The man who betrayed Napoleon.
 Died of Natural Causes

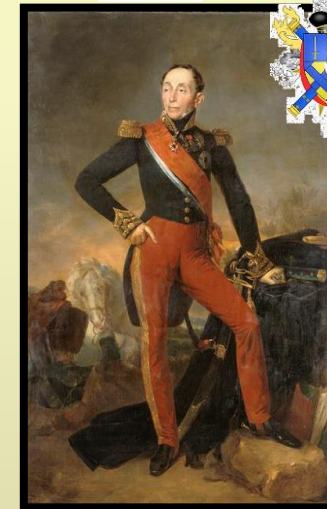
Marshal Louis Gabriel Suchet (1770-1826)
 Count. Duke of Albufera.
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor.
 Died of Natural Causes

1812



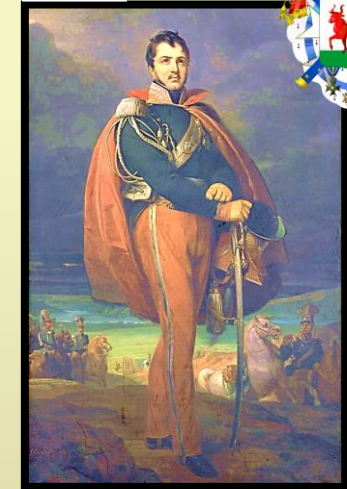
Marshal Laurent de Gouvion Saint-Cyr (1764-1830)

 Died of Natural Causes.

Marshal Emmanuel de Grouchy (1766-1847)
 Grand Eagle of the Legion of Honour
 Knight of the Order of the Iron Crown
 Grand Cross of the Military Merit
 Order of Bavaria (Wittelsbach)
 Died of natural causes

1815



Prince Joseph Poniatowski (1762-1813)
 Nephew of the King of Poland and Grand Duke of Lithuania. Appointed by Napoleon as Minister of War of the Duchy of Warsaw.
 Polish Order of Saint Stanislaus. Prussian order of the Black Eagle. Prussian Order of the Red Eagle.
 Grand Cross of the Legion of Honor.
 Grand Cross of the Polish White Eagle Star and Grand Cross Polish Virtuti Military Order
 Died drowned in Elster.
